In late June civil society organizations tracking REDD+ policies in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) sent open letters to the World Bank's Forest Carbon Partnership Facility (FCPF) and to the DRC's Environment Minister expres grave concerns about the lack of effective public and community participation in national REDD+ policy-making (see links below this article). The "REDD Climate Working Group― (GTCR), which authored the letters and is composed of a broarange of national and local environment and development NGOs in DRC, is insisting on the reorganisation of REDD governance structures in DRC to ensure decentralisation and ensure meaningful participation by civil society and forest peoples in forest and climate policy making at all levels.
